#### Bio & CV

Minoo Emami is an Iranian multidisciplinary artist with over three decades of experience dedicated to art practice, teaching, and exhibition. A first-generation college student, she transitioned from being a self-taught painter in the U.S. to formally studying art in 2015.

Minoo's work explores trauma and gender equality through storytelling in multidisciplinary art projects, particularly focusing on the experiences of women in patriarchal societies like Iran. Her perspective is shaped by her life in Iran after the Islamic revolution and during the Iran-Iraq war, including eight years of city bombings.

Beginning in 2019, Minoo incorporated self-perform videos into her paintings, enriching them with historical and family photos as backdrops. Her art reflects on the moral burdens of Islamic rules and the domestic spaces where Iranian women reside. Through her videos, she captures the psychological experiences of women within these spaces, addressing the public-private dynamic and the relationship between women's bodies and the domestic environment.

Minoo's work has been widely exhibited and collected, including in the Newport Art Museum in Rhode Island, USA, and Lettre International in Berlin, Germany. She also shares her knowledge through talks at universities and institutions in the U.S. and teaching at the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill. Minoo Emami's artistic journey is marked by her unwavering commitment to her craft, her unique perspective, and her dedication to both personal and artistic growth. Her art continues to captivate audiences, resonating on both a personal and societal level.
